



All of these people perform all different types of jobs. For example, a police officer's job is to protect people, a chef's job is to cook delicious food.

Sometimes when people have different roles and responsibilities, We say we are "wearing different hats."


Materials Needed; Coloring utensils, paper

Now we are going to think about the different "hats" you wear. First, make a list of all of your roles, or hats. Here is an example of a list: Daughter, sister, teacher, friend, student, swim team member, cousin, Jew, Girl Scout.

After everyone has made a list, pick one item on your list. Draw an actual hat that you would wear for that role.

Once you are done designing your hat, list all of the things you are responsible when you are wearing that hat. For example, if I picked sister, I would draw a big hat that represents me as a sister. Then I might list: be kind, help my younger sister at school, help my older brother with homework, share a room with my sister, etc...

Once everyone has finished his/her hat, have everyone share!



Discussion Questions:


